

## **DOG DIES OF AVIAN INFLUENZA**

**Fatal Avian Influenza (Bird Flu), in a dog, is the subject of a dispatch from Thailand, appearing in the November issue of the journal Emerging Infectious Diseases.**

**In October 2004, the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine at Kasetsart University received the body of a dog for necropsy. The owner said the dog had eaten a duck carcass from an area with reports of highly pathogenic avian influenza H5N1 infections in ducks. The dog developed high fever, panting, and lethargy about five days after eating the ducks and died the following day.**

**Case reports and research have provided evidence that H5N1 avian influenza can cross species barriers to infect cats as well as humans. Domestic cats and tigers have contracted the H5N1 virus after eating poultry harboring HPAI. Earlier this year, Germany reported fatal avian influenza in domestic cats (see JAVMA, April 15, 2006, page 1165). In Asia, large cats in captivity have died of the disease.**

**Genetic comparison indicated that the dog isolate of the H5N1 virus was similar to the viruses that researchers recovered from a tiger in Thailand during a mid-2004 outbreak.**

**The authors conclude that, like cats, dogs are at risk for H5N1 infection. They add that the possibility of humans acquiring the H5N1 virus from contact with cats or dogs is a cause for concern and highlights the need to monitor domestic animals during future outbreaks of H5N1 avian influenza.**

### SHOW ME THE MOLAR

Editor's Note ~ This article, by a veterinarian, addresses disease transmission, in checking bites, as the judge goes from dog to dog. ### SHOW ME THE MOLAR

... I was watching the AKC/Eukanuba National Championship on TV and as the Non-Sporting Group judge, Keke Kahn, approaches the first dog she says, "Show me the teeth, Sir!" The handler complies. With raised eyebrow, I wonder what she knew about the dog that I did not. She approached the next dog with the same command and each one after that. It was like the "Jerry McGuire meets Groundhog Day": "Show me the teeth! Show me the teeth!", over and over again. Suddenly the lightbulb went on and I thought, "Keke Kahn, you rock!"

After all those years of watching judges move from dog to dog, sticking their hands in mouth after mouth, finally I was seeing someone comply with the basic sanitary rules I've followed for years. As a practicing veterinarian, I wouldn't dream of moving from dog to dog without washing my hands between them! Besides the germ/disease transfer, you don't want to get me started listing all the places those mouths have been or what they've licked or consumed.

At Westminster I winced as the Pug spooked, when the judge went for his mouth. I understand he'd been scratched by a fingernail during a past exam, which apparently traumatized him. This could have been prevented if the handler showed the teeth. One AKC breed standard actually addresses this issue: *The Japanese Chin is very sensitive to oral examination. If the dog displays any hesitancy, judges are asked to defer to the handler for presentation of the bite.* I suppose each parent club could incorporate something to this effect, but there is a much easier solution!

It would be a very simple addition, to AKC rules governing dog shows, to stipulate that judges either wash or sanitize their hands after examining each dog's mouth OR allow exhibitors to show the judge the dog's bite and teeth. Requiring the judges to wash their hands between dogs would slow the judging process down, but allowing the exhibitor to show the teeth would not. It just makes good common sense, to minimize the transmission of bodily fluids, from one dog to another. Anyone who's been to a cat show knows that the judges disinfect their hands between each cat. It's such a simple solution to a multifaceted problem (i.e., spread of disease, occasional injury to a judge, damage to a dog and so on) A problem that is very real, although few seem to have noticed it! Show me the teeth! Thank you Keke!!
