New Business

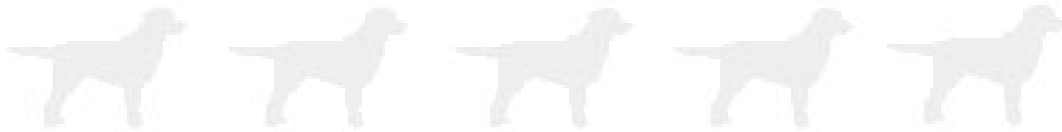

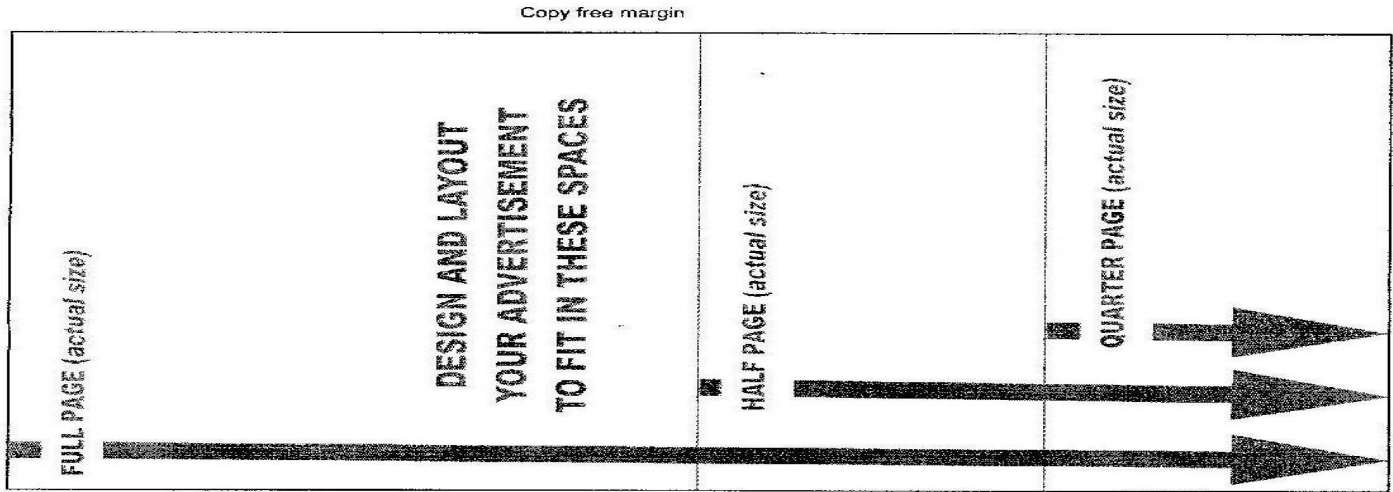

Catalog Advertising Information

- Show catalogs are produced using digital printing technology. This means that catalog advertising must be converted to electronic files. There are two options for advertisers.
1. "Let us do the work." Submit advertising copy with rough copy layout and any photographs labeled with dog's name on back of photo(s), to your club advertising chairperson. Your ad will be designed in an attractive manner and style. Your photos will be returned to you by the club advertising chairperson.
 2. Advertiser designs their ad and submits on CD to the club advertising chairperson or electronically to Garvin Show Services using these guidelines.
 - **DESIGN YOUR AD TO FIT PROPER PAGE SIZE:** Ads designed for a standard letter size 8 1/2" by 11" page **WILL NOT REDUCE CORRECTLY** to fit the standard dog show catalog page. A full page dog show catalog size is 4.5 inches wide by 7.5 inches high. Half page size is 4.5 inches wide by 3.75 inches high. Quarter page size is 4.5 inches wide by 1.88 inches high.
 - Design your ad in black and white and grayscale your photos (unless your club has color for color ads.)
 - Be sure to include the following information in your cover instructions or email.
 - The type of format you are sending
 - The names of the fonts you are using. Depending on the format you submit, you may need to send a CD (do not send fonts through the internet) of your special fonts.
 - Any logos or the art work must be converted to a photo format at 600 + dpi.
 - Do not include any linked graphics.
 - Preferred photo formats are TIF or EPS at 200 dpi. Other photo formats such as jpeg or gif will result in less quality photos. It is important to remember that the resolution available for output of a picture is based on placing the image at 100% of size. If you are enlarging the image within the publication, it would need to start at a higher resolution. For example if you place a photo at 150% of size, it would require 50% more resolution. Images taken from the Web will not print well due to their very low resolution.
- For best results submit text and photos as separate attachments**
TEXT: 1) Microsoft Word 2) Microsoft Publisher. (With either, we may not be able to reproduce your exact fonts unless you include font files with your information)
PHOTOS: 1) tiff or eps
Other acceptable formats (less quality resolution)

TRANSMISSION: Send electronic files to smc@garvinshowservices.com. Identify yourself fully in the message and indicate the show for which you are submitting. All ads received electronically will be verified with the Advertising Chairman.
PAYMENT AND DEADLINES: Payment for advertising is to be made directly to the club (not Garvin Show Services) through their advertising chairperson. All advertising must be received by the catalog advertising chairperson if sent by mail or if sent electronically to the superintendent by the advertising deadline.

~~ Goat Milk Available ~~

Great for puppies. They thrive on it and do not get the diarrhea, which cow milk causes. Great for weaning or nursing a pup that isn't thriving. Goat milk is a natural, mild anti-inflammatory. It

is also excellent for older dogs that may have some arthritis, or sick dogs that need supplementing. My milk is from Nigerian Dwarf goats, which are known for producing higher butterfat than other breeds -- so it's not a diet food. Goat milk is naturally partially homogenized, so separating the cream is not a good option. Because I have a small herd, I have a limited amount. You can pick it up, or I can freeze and ship it, or deliver to some events.

I will have soap and lotions available soon.

!! BRUCELLOSIS OUTBREAK IN LEWIS COUNTY, WASHINGTON !!

Tuesday, May 1, 2007

The Lewis County Health Department is warning anyone who has purchased or adopted a dog, since February, from a rural Lewis County woman, in the Centralia area, to have that dog tested for Canine Brucellosis, a dangerous bacterial infection.

IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE WOMAN "MAY" HAVE ATTENDED THE TIMBERLAND KENNEL CLUB DOG SHOW.

CANINE BRUCELLOSIS MAY ALSO BE TRANSMITTED TO HUMANS , ESPECIALLY CHILDREN, where it causes Flu-like symptoms.

According to the health department, a dog owned by a dog breeder and rescuer tested positive for the disease earlier this week. A total of four dogs are believed to have the disease, as of this morning. Because the infected dogs were in close contact with more than 110 dogs, it is very likely more dogs are infected with the disease. And, because the breeder kept no records, there is no way to predict how many more dogs with the disease have been sold. She had been selling the dogs at roadside, so it is impossible to trace their locations now. On the negative side, since brucellosis cannot be cured, is persistent in the environment and is a danger cross-species, including to humans, it is almost certain that most or all of the dogs on her property will be euthanized. It's also a real dilemma for anyone in the south end, because those puppies could well be in circulation at dog parks, etc...fouling those environments. Brucellosis is transmitted by contact or by contaminated food, water, and excrement.

This breeder, who lives in the Ethel-Toledo area (south of Olympia, Washington), sells several breeds of purebred and "designer" mixed breeds, including "Pugles" (beagle-pug mix) and terrier-Chihuahua mixes. In addition, she rescues dogs of all breeds and adopts them out.

All of the 110 dogs on her property have been tested for the disease, but the Health Department is advising anyone who may have bought or adopted a dog since mid-February, to have the animal tested by a veterinarian.

At-risk dogs were sold along state Route 508 near Mary's Corner, on Highway 12, at or near the Ethel Market, or from a parking lot in any of the businesses at Interstate 5 Exit# 79, in Chehalis. She is described as a woman in her 20s or 30s. She sells the dogs out of a red car. The Department of Agriculture has quarantined the breeder's property and she is forbidden to sell, give away, or otherwise remove any of the animals now there, said Kathleen Eussen, health department director. Health officials say, do not dump the dog along the road or out in the country!

Canine Brucellosis is a bacterial infection that causes abortions and infertility in females and reproductive problems and infertility in males. Because treatment is rarely successful in dogs, it is recommended that dogs with the disease be euthanized. Symptoms may be unnoticed in females, but males may have testicular swelling and infections. Other possible symptoms include lethargy, loss of libido, premature aging and swollen lymph nodes, according to the International Veterinary Information Service. In addition to causing abortion/reabsorption in bitches, and infertility in males, it can also cause kidney damage.

October 6– 12, 2007

The National Specialty week this year will begin with the hunt test on the weekend of October 6 and 7, 2007.

This is unusual scheduling, but all public lands in Oregon are closed for hunting after the first of October. Reeder's Ranch, a private gun club on Sauvie Island, has graciously allowed us to reserve their grounds for that weekend, and I am told they are really lovely grounds and far superior to the public lands, so we are in luck. The Master and Senior stakes will run on Saturday, while Sunday will be a full day with the Junior stakes, the Working Certificate and the Conformation Certificate all taking place then.

Monday everything will move to Hillsboro, Oregon, and all the rest of the activities, except the Tracking Test, will be at the Washington County Fairgrounds there and at the headquarters hotel, the Red Lion Hillsboro, next door. These are spacious grounds and we have rented a large area that will allow us to have all the rings together, making it much easier for everyone to watch the Agility. Monday we will have an optional seminar by Pat Hastings on the Puppy Puzzle, her popular seminar that emphasizes picking out the puppies at 8 weeks that will be most suitable for performance homes. We will also make available an option to take a wine tour in the Willamette Valley vineyards that day. In the late afternoon and evening, there will be an informal welcome dinner at the host hotel. Either before or after dinner (I am not yet sure of the lighting there) we will welcome the Top 25 Agility contestants, a popular feature at the National last year.

Tuesday, the events will pick up pace, with the Tracking Test at Champoeg State Heritage area, half an hour or so from the Fairgrounds, and the first of two Agility Trials in two rings at the fairgrounds. The same judges will also preside over the Top 25 and will take turns judging the courses on Tuesday and Wednesday, including the new FAST courses. The LRC Board of Directors will meet on Tuesday at the host hotel.

The schedule of events is posted on the club web site at <http://www.thelabradorclub.com/national/> You will see that one Rally trial is on Tuesday and the other on Wednesday, before the afternoon sweepstakes. We will also have an Obedience trial Wednesday morning and the other one Thursday morning. Non-regular classes, including Team, will be held on Wednesday only as the focus shifts to conformation on Thursday with the dog and bitch classes leading up to Best of Breed on Friday and of course our Juniors. I hope there will also be time to call all the dogs into the ring who have qualified for the popular Dog For All Reasons award.

Portland AKC Educational Match

April 13, 2007

Dear AKC Club:

Please take a moment to recall how you got your start in the dog world. Many of us got our first tastes for the thrill of competition at matches. Knowledgeable veterans shared their expertise and passion about the sport and became mentors and lifelong friends.

I ask you and your fellow club members to join together with other clubs in your area to share your knowledge, expertise and enthusiasm for our wonderful sport with potential newcomers by putting on an Educational Match. The AKC is establishing an Educational Match Program that will assist AKC-affiliated clubs nationwide to hold educational matches for the public. Together, we will attract and grow the next generation of fanciers and future mentors and help ensure the future of the sport of purebred dogs.

The first Educational Match in your area is a collaborative effort involving clubs from the greater Portland area and will be held June 16, 2007, at the Washington County Fairgrounds in Hillsboro, Oregon. We need you! Would you please encourage and ensure your club's participation in this kick-off event?

The Educational Match will welcome and educate new exhibitors by presenting a morning of educational activities followed by an afternoon AKC-sanctioned match. All clubs that provide significant participation in assisting with this match and educational activity will be credited for holding an AKC-sanctioned match.

Planned activities for this event include:

Dog Show procedures – A presentation explaining dog show classes, placements, and championship points and other pertinent information.

Dog Show entry assistance – A superintendent will provide assistance on how to obtain a premium list, how to get on the superintendents' mailing list, and how to fill out an entry form.

Handling class - Experienced handlers and owners will give handling instructions, including basic gaiting patterns and breed-specific handling tips.

Grooming tips – Breed-specific grooming will be presented by experienced groomers, owners or handlers.

Equipment advice – Breed-specific advice concerning leads, crates, grooming equipment etc. will be presented by experienced groomers, owners or handlers.

Vendor - A vendor will be available for new exhibitors to purchase the recommended equipment.

Service vendors – Reasonably priced booth space will be available for local training facilities and groomers in order to present their services to the attendees.

AKC Canine Good Citizen – CGC information and testing will be provided.

Companion Events – Limited (for time purposes) Agility, Obedience and Rally demonstrations

Obedience and Rally run-throughs for more experienced exhibitors at the Sanctioned "O-C" Match.

Booth – A public educational booth staffed by the local Public Education Coordinators.

Club-member participation is critical to the success of this event. Greeters will direct new exhibitors to an appropriate Group area in order to meet an individual "mentor" from within the same or a similar breed to answer questions in a personalized manner rather than relying on AKC publications to totally educate the novice. This individual mentoring is in addition to scheduled handling, grooming, and dog show basics presentations.

AKC will support the event by:

- E-mailing invitations and fliers to owners of newly eligible registered dogs in the geographic area surrounding the match.
- Assisting with developing press releases and publicity contacts.
- Providing an AKC booth with materials for local PECs to staff.
- Providing an AKC staff member to assist with the activity oversight
- Assisting with coordinating the participation of a local superintendent

What are the advantages to the clubs that participate?

- Additional entries at their future show from the new exhibitors.
- Potential new members for the clubs.
- The camaraderie of a day working with other local area clubs.
- All clubs participating at significant level will receive credit for a Sanctioned Match.

This event is a major undertaking and will benefit all of the participating clubs. By sharing the tasks between multiple clubs, you can keep the individual effort to a reasonable level.
